SAGINAW MASTER PLAN SURVEY QUESTIONS RESIDENTS ABOUT POSSIBLE CASINO

he city of Saginaw, Michigan recently questioned its residents whether they believe that a casino in the city would help revive the area in a survey designed to help craft a new Master Plan for the area. Though the plan is merely to gauge public interest, the possibility has seen supported in the media from city officials who believe that a casino could bring valuable revenue to the city.

Question sixteen of the survey asks "Should Saginaw plan for any of the following land uses?" which lists as one of the possible answers "Casino." Among the other choices are industrial redevelopment, senior housing, community gardens, and urban farming. Other questions in the survey measure participants' perception of each of the city's districts and suggested methods for improving these areas.

Odail Thomas, City Development Director, told The Saginaw News that a casino could help revitalize the city, comparing Saginaw to Anderson, Indiana. Anderson, where Thomas worked for 27 years, utilizes tax and fee revenue from a casino to help fund city expenditures. The casino and a race track in the area have been cited as helping the city transition away from a focus on automotive jobs – a similar situation to the one currently faced by Saginaw.

In conjunction with the survey, the city has scheduled community meetings for citizens to discuss ideas for the Master Plan with city staff, officials, and facilitators. The next community meeting will be held on Thursday, October 14th, at the Hoyt Library in Saginaw.
