COALITION TO TAKE CASINO PROPOSAL TO CITY COUNCIL

According to reports in both the *Lansing City Pulse* and *Lansing State Journal*, the Lansing Jobs Coalition (“Coalition”), a pro-casino group, plans to ask Lansing City Council members to approve a proposed ordinance to build a Native American casino in the city of Lansing.

The Coalition failed to gather the required 4,101 signatures needed by Sunday to put the issue on the August primary ballot, according to the reports.

The Coalition plans to ask Lansing City Council members to approve its proposed gaming ordinance independent of an election. If the council does not support the plan, the supporter’s plan is to pursue a ballot proposal for the November general election.

The Lansing Jobs Coalition was established in November, 2010 by Ted O’Dell, Gina Nelson and Sharman Ann Moore. The group has a website at: www.lansingjobscoalition.com, which provides more information on the cause.

Although local support for a tribal casino is important, it is only one of many state and federal steps that would need to take place for a tribal casino to be built. A tribal compact would need to allow for gaming in Lansing and the land for the casino location would have to be acquired pursuant to a complicated federal approval process.
