The Pokagon Band of Potawatomi donated \$62,220 in proceeds from the 2020 Four Winds Invitational to Beacon Children's Hospital. The donation will be used to purchase Centrella Smart+ Beds for the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit at Beacon Children's Hospital to improve patient mobility and prevent pressure injuries. The 2020 Four Winds Invitational was held September 4-6, and was part of the Symetra Tour - Road to the LPGA. Over the past nine years that Four Winds has hosted the tournament, the Pokagon Band has donated \$734,720 to Beacon Health System.
