GAMING INDUSTRY "G2E" TRADE SHOW KICKS OFF NEXT WEEK

he 2008 Global Gaming Expo (G2E) will be held next week, November 18-20, at the Las Vegas Convention Center in Las Vegas, Nevada. In addition, this year's G2E Training & Development Institute takes place on Monday, November 17, along with the G2E Leadership Academy taking place on the 17th and 18th. G2E is the largest gaming industry trade show, bringing together industry professionals from around the world. G2E provides an in-depth look at new products, technologies, insights and innovations within the gaming industry.

This year, G2E 2008 will feature an award-winning journalist, gaming industry executives, and tribal gaming leaders in a dynamic series of keynote events addressing the future of gaming, given the current economic climate, and how gaming companies can advance the success of their businesses.

- Keynote Addresses from CNBC contributor and award-winning journalist Ron Isana and industry leaders;

Keynote events include the following:

- CNBC contributor and award-winning journalist Ron Isana will give a keynote speech on Tuesday, November 18, sharing his thoughts on such issues as the global economy, financial markets, political policy and the alternative investment industry. Mr. Insana has more than two decades of experience as a journalist covering global economics, financial markets, public policy and the alternative investment industry.
- On Wednesday, November 19, AGA President and CEO Frank J. Fahrekopf, Jr. will moderate the *State of the Industry: The Evolution of Global Gaming* panel, which will focus primarily on the evolution of gaming in the global marketplace and how domestic and international expansion will likely shape the future of gaming. Panelists include: Armin Karu, chairman of the management board for Olympic Entertainment Group; Terry Lanni, chairman and CEO of MGM MIRAGE; Gary Loveman, chairman, CEO and president of Harrah's Entertainment, Inc.; and Ernie Stevens, Jr., chairman of the National Indian Gaming Association.
- The final keynote event, *Change and Challenges*: The Tribal-Community Connection, will focus on the Indian gaming sector and how it is fostering relationships within the communities surrounding tribal gaming operations. J.R. Matthews, vice chairman of the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma will moderate the discussion regarding the variety of ways tribal gaming impacts communities across the U.S. Panelists include: Robert Benavides, governor of Isleta Pueblo, New Mexico; John Guevremont, president and CEO of Native American Contracting Services, LLC; J. Kurt Luger, executive director of the Great Plains Indian Gaming Association; Anthony Miranda, chairman of the California Nations Indian Gaming Association; and Tracie Stevens, senior policy analyst for governmental affairs for the Tulalip Tribes. Ernie Stevens, chairman of the National Indian Gaming Association, will offer opening remarks at the event.

In addition to the keynote events, G2E features over one hundred and fifty different conference sessions covering a wide variety of gaming industry topics. This year, Michigan is well represented by a number of different speakers (see below article "Michigan Gaming Industry Experts Speak at G2E").
