Michigan Internet Gaming and Sports Betting Operators Report Combined \$136.9 Million in June Total Gross Receipts

As [reported](#) by the Michigan Gaming Control Board (MGCB), Michigan commercial and tribal internet casino gaming and sports betting operators reported a combined \$136.9 million total gross receipts in June. June receipts declined by 14.9% when compared to last month.

June internet gaming gross receipts were \$121.5 million, falling 4.6% from \$114.4 million reported in May 2022. Gross sports receipts totaled \$15.4 million, decreasing 54.2% when compared with May 2022.

Combined total adjusted gross receipts of \$114.4 million were reported for June, including \$109.4 million from internet gaming and \$5 million for internet sports betting. Total monthly internet gaming adjusted gross receipts declined 4.6% from May 2022, and internet sports betting adjusted gross receipts dropped 77.6%.

Compared with June 2021, this month's internet gaming adjusted gross receipts increased 65.3%, and internet sports betting adjusted gross sports betting receipts were down 70%.

Total internet sports betting handle at \$270 million was down by 19% compared with May 2022 results of 333.4 million.

The operators delivered \$22.8 million in taxes and payments to the State of Michigan during June, with internet gaming taxes and fees contributing \$22.5 million and internet sports betting taxes and fees contributing \$328,954.

The three Detroit Casinos – MotorCity Casino, MGM Grand Detroit, and

Greektown Casino – reported city wagering taxes and municipal service fees of \$6.3 million, with internet gaming taxes and fees contributing \$6.1 million and internet sports betting taxes and fees contributing \$201,320 for the month of June.

Tribal operators reported making total payments of \$2.5 million of wagering payments to the tribes' governing bodies according to the MGCB.

For the first half of 2022, aggregate internet gaming adjusted gross receipts totaled \$681.7 million, and aggregate internet sports betting adjusted gross receipts were \$74.1 million.
