Illegal Gambling Operation Raid in Saginaw

On June 20, 2024, the MGCB issued a <u>press release</u> regarding a recent raid on the Red Horse Bar at 4780 State Street in Saginaw, MI which uncovered an illegal gambling operation.

The Michigan Penal Code places a broad prohibition on any gambling that is not authorized by law and consequences for the illegal operation of gaming machines can include criminal charges and/or monetary fines.

The MGCB acted in response to a tip from a citizen that illegal gambling was occurring at the Red Horse Bar. Prior to the raid, the MGCB issued cease-and-desist letters, but the bar's owners Christopher and Nicholas Adams failed to comply.

Consequently, the raid was carried out on June 5, 2024, in conjunction with the Michigan State Police. Six slot-style gaming machines as well as \$2,280 in gift cards and \$5,161 in suspected gambling proceeds were confiscated by the authorities from the location. On June 6th, 2024, the Adams brothers were arraigned on felony gambling charges in the 70th District Court. They were later released on \$6,000 personal bonds and a preliminary exam was scheduled for June 24th.

MGCB Executive Director Henry Williams said, "The Michigan Gaming Control Board remains steadfast in its commitment to ensuring compliance with all state regulations, we will continue to work diligently to identify and eliminate any illegal gambling activities that

pose a threat to the integrity of the industry and the welfare of the public."

Michigan iGaming, Sports Betting Operators Report \$239.5 Million in May Revenue

As <u>reported</u> by the Michigan Gaming Control Board ("MGCB"), Michigan commercial and tribal internet gaming ("iGaming") and sports betting operators reported a combined \$239.5 million total gross receipts in May. May receipts increased 2.0% when compared to last month's results.

May iGaming gross receipts were \$198.6 million. Gross sports betting receipts totaled \$40.9 million in May. In April 2024, iGaming gross receipts were \$192.9 million and gross sports betting receipts were \$41.9 million.

The combined total adjusted gross receipts of \$206.8 million were reported for May, including \$178.7 million from iGaming and \$28.1 million from internet sports betting – representing an iGaming increase of 2.6% and an increase of 1.2% for sports betting when compared to April 2024.

Total May internet sports betting handle was \$343.7 million, a decrease of 13.9% from the \$399.1 million result in April 2024.

The operators delivered \$38.8 million in taxes and payments to the State of Michigan during May, with iGaming taxes and fees contributing \$37.0 million and internet sports betting taxes and fees contributing

\$1.8 million.

The three Detroit Casinos – MotorCity Casino, MGM Grand Detroit, and Greektown Casino – reported city wagering taxes and municipal service fees of \$10.1 million, with iGaming taxes and fees contributing \$9.4 million and internet sports betting taxes and fees contributing \$665,117 for the month of May.

Tribal operators reported making total payments of \$4.5 million of wagering payments to the tribes' governing bodies in May according to the MGCB.

An online gaming and sports betting revenue distribution <u>table</u> is available on the agency's website.

As of May, a total of 15 commercial and tribal operators have been authorized to launch iGaming and/or internet sports betting. Currently, 12 commercial and tribal operators offer internet sports betting, and 15 operators offer iGaming. Details for each operator's internet gaming and internet sports betting results are available and published on the MGCB website.

NHBP Gaming Commission Wins Regulatory Award

On June 26, 2024, Indian Gaming <u>published</u> an article announcing the Nottawaseppi Huron Band of the Potawatomi ("NHBP") Gaming Commission's recognition by the North American Gaming Regulators Association ("NAGRA") with their 2024 Excellence in Gaming Team Award. The award was presented at the NAGRA Annual Education and Training Conference.

The NHBP's award serves as a manifestation of their sustained achievements and contributions to gaming regulation. Some of these achievements include adopting regulations addressing aspects of the gaming industry such as licensing, audit, investigations, IT, hearings, exclusions, and enforcement. The Commission values and ensures transparency by engaging with the public via town hall meetings and postings.

Jacob Sheber, the NHBP Gaming Commission Investigations Manager, said, "This recognition is a testament to the dedication and hard work of our entire team...I am incredibly proud to work alongside such talented and committed individuals. We are grateful to NAGRA for acknowledging our efforts."
